


KIDZ KLUB

The Kidz Klub is a supervised daycare center for children 4-12 years old. The service is complimentary and features exciting activities such as a Glass Bottom Boat Ride, Pirates Treasure Hunt, Beach Shell Search and more. Rosehall Great House Tour

The Rosehall Great House has a story with all the elements of an engaging novel. Built in 1770 by John Palmer and his wife, it eventually became the residence of their grandnephew, John Rose Palmer.
