Emmanuel Iheukwumere is the principal shareholder of Emmanuel Law Firm, LLC, a Philadelphia plaintiffs' personal injury firm with a principal focus on medical malpractice and other catastrophic injury matters. He is also an adjunct professor of law at Temple University School of Law and a fellow of the Academy of Advocacy. He has previously worked as a defense attorney and as a judicial law clerk. An experienced trial lawyer recognized by his peers as one of the best personal injury attorneys in Pennsylvania with the thrice designation of a Pennsylvania Super Lawyer, Mr. Iheukwumere is a past chair of the Minority Bar Committee of the Pennsylvania Bar Association and a member of the board of *The Philadelphia Lawyer* magazine and the Philadelphia Trial Lawyers Association.
